Important Information

Pick up your bowel preparation from your pharmacy as soon as possible.

You must arrange for someone 18 years or older to come with you to and from your colonoscopy and stay during your visit to drive you home. Your colonoscopy may need to be rescheduled if you do not have a driver.

Check with your insurance company before your procedure to ensure coverage and plan to bring copays if necessary.

You will be getting a call from our Pre-Assessment office 4-7 days prior to procedure.

5 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

Stop taking:

- Coumadin, Plavix
- Iron, Fish Oil, Multivitamins
- Ibuprofen products or any other blood thinners

4 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

Stop taking:

- Canagliflozin (Invokana), dapagliflozin (Farxiga), empagliflozin (Jardiance), ertugliflozin (Steglatro), and bexagliflozin (Brenzavvy).

3 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

Stop taking:

- SGLT2 (if not already stopped)
- Liraglutide - (Saxenda, Victoza)
- Xarelto
- Eliquis

2 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

If you have not spoken with Pre-Assessment, please call:

864-537-0096

- Press 0 to speak with a nurse
- Press 1 if your procedure is scheduled to be Downtown
- Press 2 if your procedure is scheduled to be at Eastside

If you do not speak with Pre-Assessment **prior** to your procedure, your procedure may be cancelled.

DAY BEFORE PROCEDURE:

NO FOOD

Stop taking:

- Lixisenatide (Adlyxin- SQ once daily)
- Byetta

GI lab will call you between 1:00 and 5:00pm to let you know what time to arrive for your procedure.

Drink only clear liquids. (water, apple juice, Gatorade, tea, coffee, 7- up, Sprite, Ginger-ale, Jell-o, popsicles, chicken / beef broth.)

DO NOT CONSUME ANY MILK, DAIRY, CREAMER, RED, PURPLE, OR BLUE DYES.

Start your colon prep as instructed.
